Cliffside Villages House Rules Reminder.....



USE OF HOME ENTERTAINMENT SYSTEMS

Just a reminder on the volume levels, to include the bass settings, whenever our residents use their home entertainment systems. Because our buildings are made of wood and drywall, noise is transmitted very easily to surrounding apartments. This problem is made much worse in the late evening or early morning hours when there is very little noise outside to help mask the sounds. Because of this we would like to ask that everyone be especially cognizant of the noise issues when using these types of systems.

EXCERSISE OR MOVING FURNITURE IN A 2ND FLOOR UNIT

Noise is <u>not limited</u> to home entertainment systems, also including children running around, using heavy exercise equipment such as weights or treadmill, pushing heavy furniture across the room instead of picking them up, the sound will be amplified even worst if your unit has wood floor. Please keep in mind your neighbor's peace and quiet right. Mahalo for your cooperation!

- When trick-or-treating Never enter a stranger's home
- Be cautions when crossing a street Look in both directions before crossing. If you have a younger sibling, hold hands as you cross the street. If there is a traffic light, wait for the crosswalk light to flash before crossing.
- Please let your parents know where you are going, if you drive to a Halloween Party If you are an older child that drives, let your parents know where you'll be hanging out for the night. This seems strict, but parents need to know these things especially on Halloween night when things are most likely to happen. Also, make sure you have enough gas to get where you're going.
- Don't vandalize home/yard, cars or businesses. Throwing eggs or toilet paper are not cool and can get you into serious trouble with the law.
- When the night is done check candy thoroughly and throw away any unwrapped or unmarked candy in your trick or treat bag.

Halloween Costume Safety Tips:

The right costume for you or your child can make all the difference for a fun and safe Halloween. Adults seem to go more for horror themed costumes, while kids seem to go for super heroes, fantasy or the popular TV cartoon of the day.

- •Letting your child pick out his or her own costume, within reason, will give them a sense of responsibility and make them feel more independent that they were able to select their own costume.
- •You should only purchase costumes that are made of flame retardant material. If they are homemade, make sure you use fabrics that are inherently flame resistant, such as nylon and polyester. The federal Flammable Fabrics Act (FFA) requires costumes sold at retail to be flame-resistant. To prevent costume-related burns, the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) enforces this requirement and recalls costumes and other products that violate the FFA act. If you are going to make a homemade costume.
- Try to work reflector strips into your child's costume, a flash light or light stick to make them more visible at night. This will make them more visible by drivers and you can keep an eye on them as well if they get ahead of you while out trick or treating.
- •Whether store bought or homemade, Halloween costumes should be fun or scary, yet safe. Below are some ideas to hazard-proof your Halloween fun. Costumes should be scary to those who see them, not those who wear them! Here are some easy tips to make your Halloween a safe and happy one!
- •Make sure that your costume fits properly to avoid any accidents like tripping over a long dress or cape. Make sure that it is comfortable since it will probably be worn for several hours. Do not include high heel shoes or long dangling pieces of costume that could be tripped over. A scraped knee or bloody nose can really ruin the fun.
- •If they are carrying a prop such as a scythe or sword, make sure they are made out of a flexible plastic that will bend if fallen on. Most of the props available today are made of flexible plastic.
- •If you have more than one child, save costumes from year to year to pass down to younger children or exchange them with friends. You can add extra accessories or dress them up a little to make them different from year to year.
- •If you plan on doing any trick-or-treating with a group, make sure that your group isn't too big and that you all have some type of reflective or flashing item on your person so cars can see you. Choose or make the costume a unique one, so it can be spotted easily in a crowded area. Use flashing lights or jewelry to stand out. If you are wearing a mask, make sure that it is comfortable, has adequate eye holes and proper ventilation. If you have to cut the eye holes bigger, just use matching grease paint around your eyes to fill in where you have removed mask.
- •Picking your costume should be a fun and exciting time for you and your child. Just take your time, try it on in the store if possible and make sure that it's something that you really like!
